President's Report

2023 has seen a substantial recovery in our membership which in August had reached 1310, close to our membership immediately pre Covid (2019). This has been enabled by the attraction of over 365 new members, 66 of whom have joined since early June, taking advantage of our mid-year pro rata fee. Vice-President Sharon Carter, our Marketing group leader, has continued to leverage the power of social media to get the word out to prospective new members. As well as new member attraction, over 400 non-members have subscribed to our e-bulletin to keep abreast of what we are doing.

Our course offering has returned to pre-Covid levels with around 65 year-long courses and over 50 short courses. The new Course Coordination team led by Neil Rickards has settled in well.

We have over 20 Let's Do groups, an increase of five since 2022. Many new members appear to be joining to undertake Let's Do activities. Altogether 35% of our members participate in at least one Let's Do group.

One of the highlights of the year has been *Approaching the Voice*, the series of lectures presented by staff of the Faculty of Arts, University of Melbourne convened by the Dean. This was well attended by members and friends who appreciated the insights shared by the four lecturers. This series was conceived, pursued and organised by committee member Merilyn Harris, a truly exceptional achievement. We expect this initiative to be the beginning of an ongoing relationship with the University.

Our 140 volunteers give us 16,000 hours of their time each year. We continue to be deeply appreciative of the exceptional dedication and enthusiasm of our tutors, Let's Do leaders and Course Coordination, Admin and IT, website, e-bulletin teams. We are hoping that many of our 365+ new members will join their ranks.

The Committee of Management has adopted a strategic plan for the next three years which is anchored around four objectives:

- 1. To drive membership in a financially sustainable manner.
- 2. To build a strong brand identity.
- 3. To recruit and retain skilled tutors, Let's Do leaders and administrators.
- 4. To build community collaborations.

Finally, I want to acknowledge the exceptional work of the Committee of Management. All eleven members work hard collectively and with their respective group to enable us to provide quality services to members and to grow and develop.




Notes to the Financial Statements

The result for 2022/23 financial year was a deficit of \$(16,222) which is a more favourable position than anticipated as the budgeted deficit was \$(24,099). Growth in revenue contributed to the reduced deficit as a result of increased membership fees of 18% when compared to 2022/23, and an uplift of interest rates on investments from 1% (and below) to 4.45%. Membership numbers increased by 16% from 1,108 in 2021/22 to 1,286 in 2022/23.

Expenditure increased by 20% due in the main to classroom hire costs incurred as courses reverted to face-face and the number of courses increased, offset against a reduction in general operating expenses. However, classroom hire costs remained well below the costs prior to COVID lockdowns in 2018/19. Other expenses included an increase in member and volunteer costs due to additional member and volunteer events and other membership related costs.

We look forward to another year of increased membership, varied and interesting courses and social activities, and a reduction in accumulated surpluses.

Course Coordination

The Course Coordination team engage and liaise with new and existing Tutors to plan, develop and schedule a diverse program of yearly, semester and short courses.

Julienne Wight, the sole member of the course coordination team until early 2022 retired in December 2022 with a new team of 5 members replacing her. On behalf of U3A Melbourne City, I would like to thank Julienne for single-handedly providing courses for our members over the Covid years. We owe her an enormous debt of gratitude!

The current team of seven members have settled into an excellent working relationship. The team is made up of Russell Huntington (Chair), Nene Macwhirter (Tutor Mentor and Recruitment), Angelique D'Agostino (Year-Long Coordinator), Margi Breare (Short Course Coordinator), Jacci Moss (Venue Bookings), Diana Yu (General Support) and Neil Rickards (Quality Coordinator). We are still, though, on a learning curve and, as the tutors would know, making efficiency modifications to our procedures. These modifications included the recommendation and introduction by Angelique of new IT solutions. Thanks goes to all team members for their hard work and dedication.

This year we offered the full range of face-to-face classes plus a number of online classes via Zoom from the start. Many members have said how pleased they were to be able to return to meet up with all their class members again. In 2023 we have offered approximately 110 yearlong, semester and short courses via face-to-face and online modes. This is an increase of around 20 courses since last year. We hope to add more in 2024 to cater for our increased membership.

The course feedback process continued this year but under a new policy where new courses and new tutors are surveyed plus a three-year rotating survey of continuing courses with a third surveyed each year. This offers our members the opportunity to provide feedback on their courses. This is helpful to tutors and gives our U3A the opportunity to refine and improve our course offerings. Thanks goes to all the members and tutors who have participated with an average of a 58% response rate from members. This is much higher than any equivalent voluntary survey.

We owe an enormous debt of gratitude to our tutors and presenters who have continued to offer such a diverse range of high-quality courses. Two events were held during the year to thank all our tutors for all their work and to give them the opportunity to meet, socialise and put faces to names. We are holding an afternoon tea in October 2023 to wrap up the year. Thanks to Nene Macwhirter for all her work with tutor recruitment and development and arranging the tutor event this year. We have welcomed a number of new tutors in 2023 and we must say farewell to others. We say farewell and thanks to Pat Collins who will finish up at the end of this year after offering 13 years of mainly Mahjong courses. Anna Jardon will retire this year after offering 9 years of Italian courses. Paul O'Brien and Fiona Graham-Murray have decided to retire from tutoring in 2024 after offering respectively German and Movie Discussion courses for 8 years. We thank Pat, Anna, Fiona and Paul for their fantastic contributions to our U3A and offer them our very best wishes. Lynn Banna and Frankie Devlin are also retiring, and we thank them also for their contribution. For those tutors who are 'taking a break' in 2024, that being Marcia Katting and Ray Matters, we thank you for your contributions and hope to see you again soon!
